# Family Urgent Response System (FURS)

A free, 24/7/365, immediate, trauma-informed support for children and youth (up to age 21) currently or formerly in foster care in California and their caregivers.

Available during any "situation of instability" as defined by the child, youth, or caregiver.

### **Components:**

- Statewide helpline
- County-based mobile response teams

**Funding:** \$30 Million (GF)





# Family Urgent Response System (FURS)

#### Impact

- FURS receives ~5,000 requests for support annually.
- FURS increases stability and access to ongoing support.

### The 2024-25 Budget & Next Steps

- Coalition of over 1,000 organizations opposed the elimination of FURS, resulting in fully restored funding.
- Turning to increase awareness of FURS in the community and further strengthen FURS as a reliable, trusted resource.





## **Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster** Children

### Addresses one of the top barriers to stable family homes for children in foster care: lack of access to affordable child care.

Meets the child care needs of prospective working foster parents, relative caregivers, and parenting youth in foster care.

### **Components**:

- Vouchers to pay for child care
- Navigation support
- Training and coaching for providers

Funding: \$87.1 Million







## **Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster** Children

#### Impact

Ensures stable placements for children and youth in family homes, which ulletis vital to their well-being and a focus of Continuum of Care Reform (CCR).

#### Next Steps

- Increasing caregiver and social worker outreach about this critical resource.
- Expanding eligibility criteria to ensure all eligible resource parents,  $\bullet$ including those at FFAs, and expectant and parenting youth can take advantage of the program.
- Expanding voucher beyond 12 months under certain circumstances.
